# DAY ONE

### **ARRIVAL: WELCOME TO YOUR DALLAS EXPERIENCE!**

One way to start your Dallas trip is by Touring the Ewing Mansion and re-live exciting moments from the series in the "Dallas Legends" exhibit, featuring an exciting array of memorabilia from the series. See the gun that shot JR, Lucy's Wedding Dress, and The Dallas Family Tree. Stay for a private Chuckwagon Dinner for your group that includes a singing cowboy greeter and a BBQ meal with all the fixins' served on an authentic Chuckwagon!

# DAY TWO

### **MORNING: SEEK, WANDER, EXPLORE.**

Start your second day in the city with breakfast at San Martin Artisan Bakery, famous for its Guatemalan-style breakfast and inexpensive artisanal bread. Eat at the restaurant or take some pastries with you for a morning picnic.

Then, take in a little presidential history and visit the George W. Bush Presidential Library and Museum. Have your picture taken in the Oval Office and experience the interactive Decision Points Theater and the 911 Memorial. Or visit The Sixth Floor Museum, located within the former Texas School Depository building, which chronicles the life, assassination, and legacy of President John F. Kennedy.

#### FOR LUNCH: TAKE A BREATH OF FRESH AIR


For lunch, take a stroll through Klyde Warren Park and participate in one of the many daily activities for the public, ranging from tai chi and yoga to outdoor concerts and films. Grab a bite from 'Food Truck Lane,' with a variety of cuisine options available on weekdays and weekends

#### **AFTERNOON: TAKE IN THE ARTS SCENE**

Then it is time to walk along Flora Street in The Dallas Arts District, home to some of Dallas's most significant cultural landmarks, including the Dallas Museum of Art, one of the ten largest art museums in the country, The Nasher Sculpture Center, and The Crow Museum of Asian Art. Don't miss the Reeves Collection at the Dallas Museum of Art to see a reproduction of the only villa designed by Coco Chanel and to admire authentic Chanel-designed furniture.

### FOR DINNER: HOME, HOME ON THE RANGE

For dinner, relax and enjoy a new restaurant at the Reunion Tower, Crown Block, and dine on another level up in the sky with breathtaking views of the city. This location can accommodate your group of up to 100.





# **DAY THREE**

#### **MORNING: STOP AND SMELL THE ROSES**

Start with a light breakfast at your hotel and then explore the <u>Pallas Arboretum and Botanical Gardens</u>, one of the most beautiful outdoor attractions in Dallas, which features 66 acres of spectacular display gardens that showcase incredible seasonal flowers, ornamental shrubs, trees, and plant collections in a serene setting on White Rock Lake. Enjoy a three-course tea or a meal at one of the restaurants located within the Arboretum. Please note the Arboretum has several iconic displays, such as Autumn at the Arboretum, when 100,000 pumpkins decorate the gardens and form a whimsical pumpkin village.

# FOR LUNCH: HEAD TO THE BISHOP ARTS DISTRICT

In the afternoon, explore a historic neighborhood, <u>Bishop Arts District</u>, a hidden gem for tourists and a favorite with locals of today and the past and a favorite of Bonnie and Clyde back in the 30s. The neighborhood is filled with local restaurants and boutiques.

Or explore <u>Deep Ellum</u>, where there is some of the best BBQ in Texas at <u>Pecan Lodge</u> or at nearby <u>Terry Black's BBQ</u>, where the pit master is always happy to reveal his secrets! Discover <u>Blues Alley</u>, a tribute to the history of blues in this historical neighborhood considered the cradle of Texas Blues. The Alley showcases the work of local artists and artists who originated from Deep Ellum and have now become famous, including the father of Texas Blues, Blind Lemon Jefferson.

#### **AFTERNOON: RETAIL THERAPY**

After lunch, do some shopping at NorthPark
Center, which offers 230 shops covering the
entire spectrum of fashion. The center also
features a world-renowned art collection. If
you need more, across from NorthPark, you will
find The Shops At Park Lane, offering a curated
collection of outlet stores, perfect for finding the
best bargains in town.

# ■ FOR DINNER: FOR THE SPORTS ENTHUSIAST

For dinner, take a VIP tour of AT&T Stadium, home of the Dallas Cowboys, and stay to see America's team in action. Or, if you prefer basketball or hockey, head over to the American Airlines Center to watch the Dallas Mavericks or Dallas Stars. If you're an arts enthusiast, head to the The Dallas Arts District and enjoy one of several eateries and explore the performing arts scene. Dallas is also home to wonderful live performances. Experience the Dallas Symphony Orchestra at the Morton H. Meyerson Symphony Center, catch a Broadway show at the Winspear Opera House, or watch the Texas Ballet Theater at the Dallas City Performance Hall
